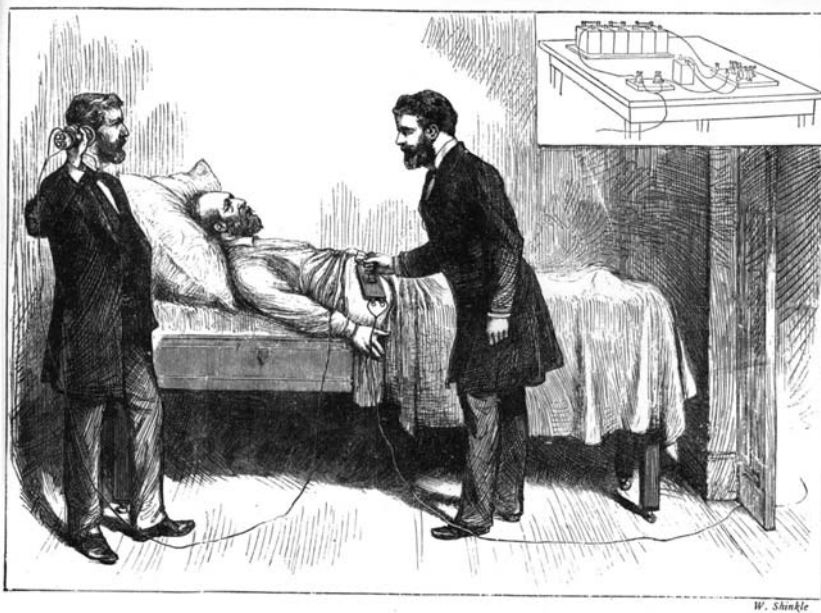

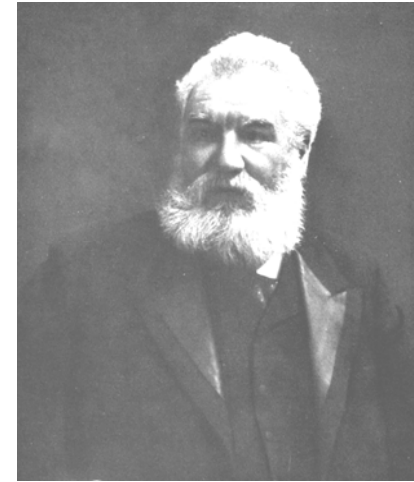
## Dr. Bell, Inventor of Telephone, Dies
