## About the letter **E**

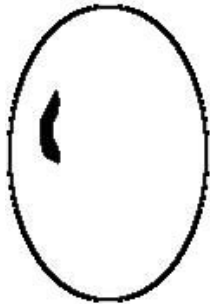
The letter **e** is a vowel. That means it has more than one sound.

The long **e** sound sounds like the name of the letter. It is the **e** sound you hear in the word

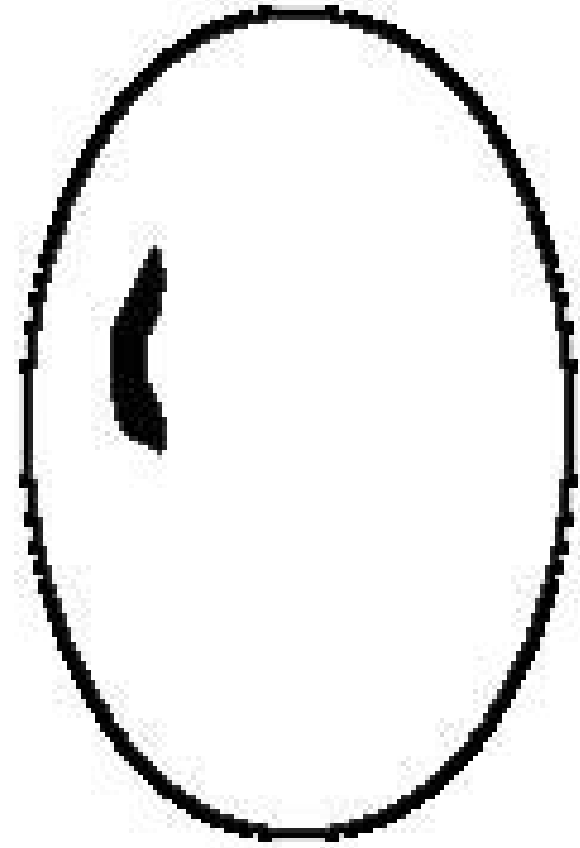

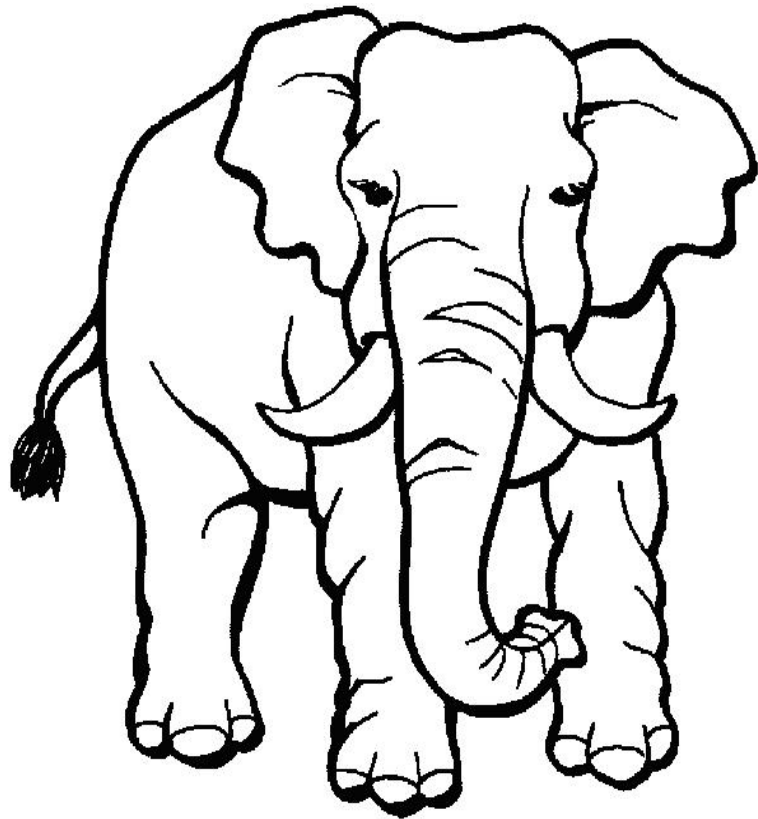
The short **e** sound is softer. It sounds like the **e** you hear in the word






