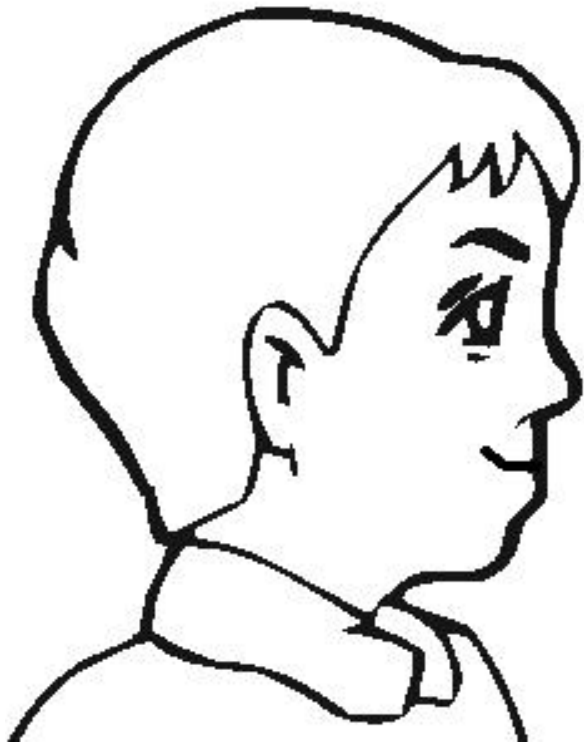
Sometimes it will be a capital

Th sounds like the start of

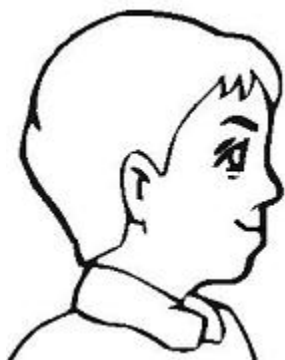

The letter **h** is a consonant. This letter has only one sound.

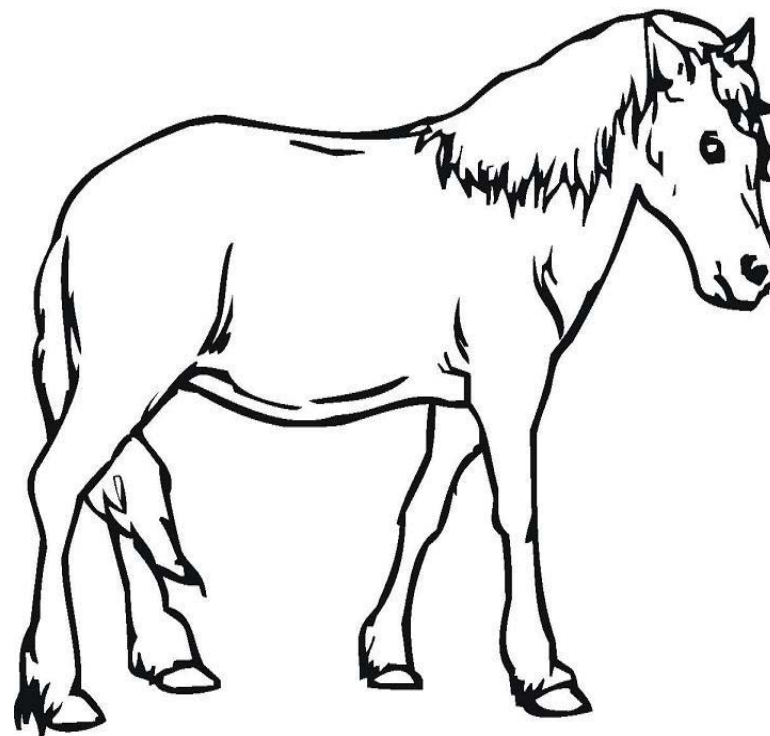

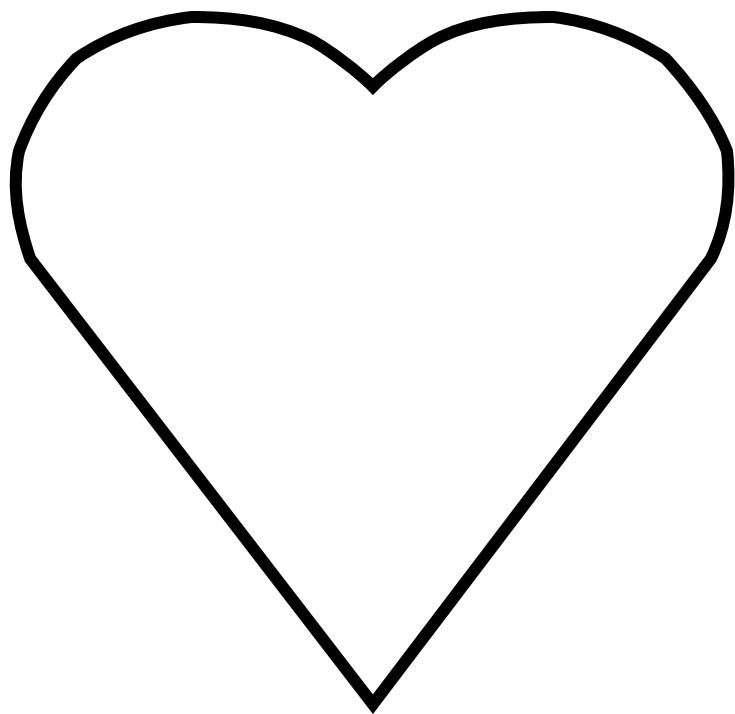
Now that you have traced the letters **H** and **h**, let's see if you can write them yourself.

Write the capital letter **H** 15 times.

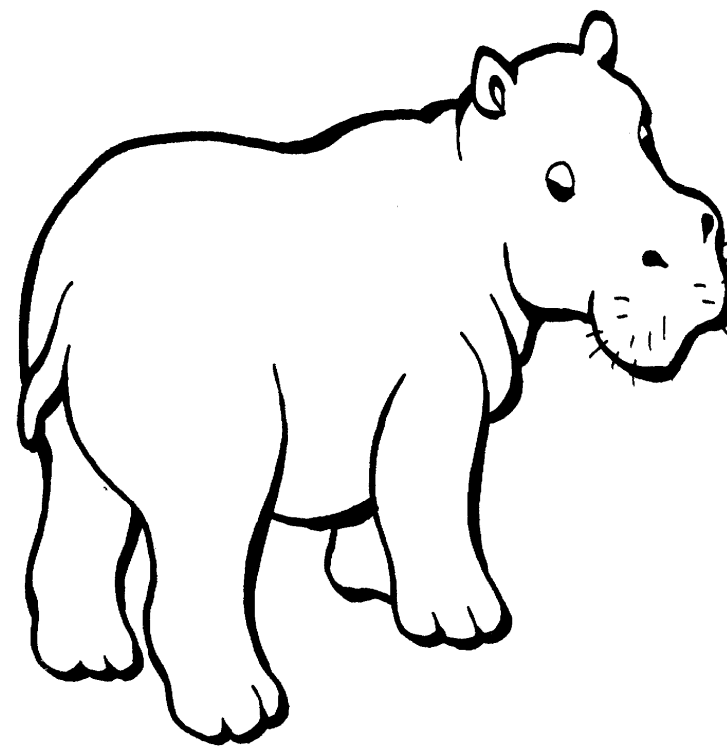
