About the letter **X**

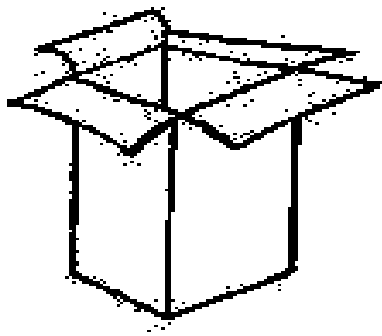
The letter **X** is a consonant. This letter has only one sound.

The **X** sound sounds the same as a **K** and an **S** together. It sounds like the beginning of:

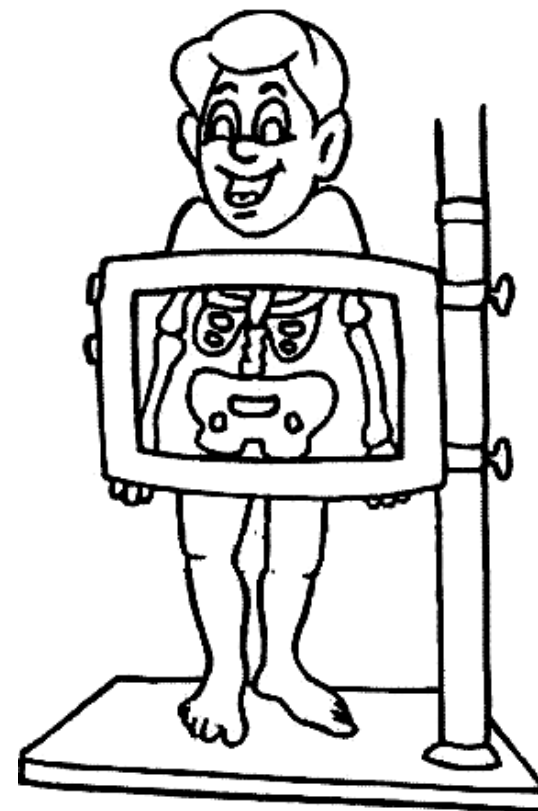
